Dr. Angeliki Lazaridou is an Associate Professor of Educational Administration and Leadership, in the School of Humanities and Social Sciences of the University of Thessaly, Greece and a Fulbright Scholar. She has a bachelor's in Pedagogy and a Training Diploma in Special Education-Early Intervention , both from the University of Athens, a Master's Degree in Early Childhood Special Education from the University of Alberta, Canada and a Doctorate in Educational Administration and Leadership from the same university. She has taught in undergraduate and postgraduate programs of the Open University of Cyprus, the Hellenic Open University, the University of Cyprus and the University of Nicosia. Her teaching and research interests focus on school administration and leadership, with an emphasis on issues of principalship, teacher leadership, evaluation and supervision, ethics and values, gender, and social justice. She has co-authored the book *Shaping Social Justice Leadership: Insights of Women Educators Worldwide* with Linda Lyman and Jane Strachan. She has also authored a book on Case Studies in Educational Administration [in Greek], and she has edited the Greek translation of Linda Lyman's book *Brain Science for Principals. What School Leaders Need to Know*. Her published work can be found in renowned international journals in the field of Educational Administration, in reputable Greek scientific journals, in collective volumes, and in conference proceedings. She is a reviewer in international and Greek scientific journals and she has also participated in scientific committees of international and Greek conferences. She is currently serving as an Associate Editor at *Frontiers in Education*, in the Educational Leadership section. Dr. Lazaridou has supervised doctoral theses, and has participated in doctoral theses review committees in Greece and abroad. Finally, she has been an expert for the evaluation of European Union research programs (Horizon 2020 action), an evaluator of the IKY and a member of the evaluation committee of the Research and Innovation Foundation of Cyprus.
