Dr. Ioanna Giannakopoulou has a Ph.D. in Educational Research in the School of Humanities and Social Sciences of the University of Thessaly, Greece and a literature teacher in secondary education. She has a bachelor in Greek Language and Literature and a Master's Degree in Comparative Literature, both at Greek Literature Department, from the University of Thessaloniki. Her doctoral thesis is on researching the construction of subjectivity and the connection between experience and literature through the reading history of an ex drug user (Department of Pedagogy, University of Thessaloniki). She has taught adults ex drug users and prisoners for several years in secondary education. She has also taught in postgraduate programs of the University of Thessaly. Her teaching and research interests focus on vulnerable groups, minorities, gender, quality methodology, especially narrative analytics.

She is the author of articles about education, literature and vulnerable groups in collective volumes and in conference proceedings.
