3. CONTENT

The aim of the course is to explore the main facets of Modern Greek prose during the 20th century through the reading of texts that are representative of specific aesthetic trends and techniques.

Issues that constitute the object of investigation are:

literary movements, trends and writers that have shaped the Greek literary landscape in relation to historical, ideological and aesthetic contexts

Symbolism in prose writing

Greek modernism and postmodernism

Ideological and aesthetic quests in post-war prose.

tradition and the avant-garde, with emphasis on changes caused by both literary innovations and socio-political conditions international influences on contemporary Greek literature

narrative techniques and stylistic features with which twentieth-century writers experimented.

As part of the course, students will practice the systematic reading of novels by major modern Greek prose writers.
