Systematically collect observation data on the organization of a school's culture and the pedagogical-didactic environment of the classroom. Interpret and evaluate, in a theoretically substantiated manner, findings from observations concerning the outcomes of pedagogical and didactic practices in primary schools. Identify which teaching practices and classroom management strategies promote and which hinder the learning process and the social inclusion within the school environment. Recognize the role and significance of the pedagogical relationship in the academic success of all students. Develop the ability to critically approach and analyze the entirety of the practices implemented in a school unit. Recognize reflective capacity as an essential part of a teacher's role.
